1. Welcome, Introductions and Apologies

Apologies as listed above. Ian welcomed everyone following our last meeting on 24th February and explained that a key aspect of the meeting will focus on procurement so all know what options are fully for frameworks as price was the biggest issue the sector was facing at the moment.



2. Presentation by Biller Miller of Coffee Conscience

A copy of this presentation is attached to the Minutes.

3. TUCO Framework Updates (Nicola)

Nicola reported that no new tenders had been awarded since February. They are in the middle of a lot of new tenders and at the Research and Strategy stage with several.

Fresh Fish and Seafood: due August

Fruit and Veg: tender was being prepared however now on hold as STS have changed their service, so we have a new provider – Micron 2. This has now been extended until 2nd October. Both Aberdeen and Edinburgh use this framework and asked why Total Produce and Mark Murphy are still being shown as two separate companies? Nicola will take this up with Jane Eve.

Action: Nicola

Design and Installation: SQs are in and are being evaluated. The results will be into the Tender Working Party by the middle of next week. They have had a lot more responses than last time – some very good and some poor. This agreement was originally put in place four years ago.

Sandwiches: The ICT is currently being evaluated and is due to go live on 1st July. Sampling was held during the previous week.

Soft Drinks: This has been extended into its final year and will expire in September. Tender documents are out and returns are due on 15th June.

Kinetics: (Accommodation, Event, Catering and Hotel management software) 4 Lots – tender was due to start April 2022, but the process isn't underway yet. Still engaging with suppliers and ascertaining the scope.

We have quite a number of DPS frameworks including EPOS, which has four new suppliers on there. Bleep, Datasym, Uniware & Zonal have been added as new providers.

CICS: The next date for SQ is 18th May.

Kitchen Equipment Maintenance: Hobart have been awarded onto Lots 1, 2 and 3 but Overclean have asked to be removed from the framework.

Contract Review Meetings

Grocery Frozen and Chilled: This will be done throughout May if anyone would like to join.

It was noted that members have been relying more and more on SMEs as the bigger companies do not want to deliver up to Scotland.

Pricing

Alcohol:

The main factors having an impact on prices are:

- Cost of inflation
- Raw materials
- Harvests (particularly in Ukraine)
- Cost of living
- Transport and shipping
- Fuel increases

Alcohol: No price increases as yet.

Convenience Retail: Four suppliers have put up their prices.

Fresh Fish: Norwegian salmon prices are at their highest level ever.

Catering Light & Heavy: impacted by soaring raw material costs like Stainless Steel (39%) Aluminium (51%) Churchill products will be around 2.25 times higher than 2019/20 due to soaring energy costs, clay, labour, packaging. Mirrored by other manufacturers. Again, due to fuel hikes, expect more increases on crockery!

Sandwiches: Sandwich King has put price of the egg related products up due to their egg price has gone by 50%. It was caused by shortage of eggs due to Avian Flu outbreak across the UK & Europe which has seen over 2 million laying birds culled.

Soft Drinks: Jane's Beverages, Bidfood and Brakes have brought in price rises. Grocery, Frozen and Chilled: Bidfood' monthly market prices are changing constantly mainly on oils and fresh fish. Brakes have actually had fewer price changes than others.



The SMEs have been struggling. Many lines are either not available or being replaced. Gluten-free products in particular are in short supply.

Mandy Johnston has been looking at carbon reduction vs offsetting and Nicola asked if members have directives in place to reduce their carbon footprint rather than offsetting.

4. APUC Report

Fruit & Veg: This needs to be re-tendered to go live on 20th December. The process is now starting. The price window closed on 1st May and is currently being reviewed.

Meat & Poultry: This expires on 1st March 2023 so will be re-tendered towards the end of the year. There have been price increases with McClaires and CTM – the price of poultry has gone up 33% in the last few weeks and we have since had a further two exceptional price increases come in.

Bakery: This went live on 7th September 2019 and is open for a one-year extension. We will be expecting price increases coming in in the summer.

Dairy: This commenced 22nd October 2021 and pricing windows have been changed to quarterly. Grahams have requested an increase of 10 pence per litre for all milk-related products but this has since been cut to 6 pence per litre.

Fresh Fish & Seafood: We have had three exceptional price variation requests. The price of salmon has gone up by 50% but we are hoping that this will stablilise in the next couple of months. The price of white fish is also rising now.

Janitorial Cleaning Products: This is currently being evaluated and hoping to go live on 2nd August.

The plastic packaging tax came into force on 1st April. We are keeping an eye on the HGV Drivers shortage. There are now more drivers but salaries have rocketed.

Ukraine

APUC have issued a questionnaire on the impact of sanctions. The next Quarterly Market Impact report is out at the end of June. Stocks of Sunflower Oil are very low as most of it comes from Ukraine. There has been a 35% tarif imposed on plastic, cardboard and tin.

Sustainability

They are still working on climate change and carbon reduction and are also working on the FNT30 Plan for zero carbon. They are still working with EcoVadis on supply chain and sustainability. The ban on single-use plastics will be coming into force in Scotland on $1^{\rm st}$ June.

5. TUCO Academy Update

March saw the return of Study Tour with the Vegan and Vegetarian Tour to both Newcastle (9 delegates) and London (14 delegates) for which we had very good collaboration with Vegetarian Express and LWC. There will be more study tours planned – four in the UK and one in Europe, probably in January to coincide with Expo Grüne Woche in Berlin. We will also look to do something with Studentwerke over there.



June will see the return of Development Days with Food Photography on 8th June and a Food Waste Webinar on 30th June. Sarah asked members to sign up for this by the end of May deadline as there is some analysis to do beforehand.

She has been running mostly online but also some face-to-face courses now. The online ones reduce travel costs as well as time spent travelling. Compliance courses are at cost value of the certification, ie Level 2 costs £15 per delegate.

Upcoming webinars include a Youth Nutrition session on 27th May where sample bars will be sent out to the first people who sign up. There is a session with Softbank Robotics on 30th May which will be looking at solutions for the labour shortage.

There are now 13 people signed up for the Menus of Change Conference at Hudson Valley in June. We are continuing to build our strategic partnership with the Culinary Institute of America regarding Menus of Change.

Sarah will also be looking to roll out some Chef training.

We have a confirmed date for our Winter Conference - 30th November at Newcastle University where the theme will be Horizon Planning.

There will be a social event the night before at a restaurant where sustainability is high on their Agenda. Presentations at the Conference include speaker Charles Banks of thefoodpeople and a session on Cultured Meat. There will be a study tour taking place following the Conference.

6. Sustainability

At the last meeting Ian had talked about labelling and Saffron linking up with PlanGlow. Andy explained that there had been a lot of pressure on the Scottish government to bring about changes to the school meals plan. At Ayrshire College they are serving free soup and free porridge. The government are also looking at recording the calorific value of all products. St Andrews are working on Scope 3 reporting on carbon. APUC are trying to get a carbon footprint for their furniture framework. Saffron has a built-in carbon reporting tool. Ian will supply the Saffron detail which builds their carbon footprint.

7. Board Update

Alan reported that the Board last met in March and the discussions were around the TUCO Strategy as it was felt that the KPIs were out of date. It is planned for Chair Phil Rees-Jones to get feedback from members at the summer Conference. We will then hold a 'Board Day' along with the Team to review the Strategy and bring it forward to 2023.

On the finance side we had budgeted for a deficit of around £500K whereas the actual figure was £115K. Our rebate income is now back to 80% of pre-COVID levels. Rent and rate rebates and the Job Retention scheme also helped to reduce the deficit. There is a threat of members contracting out their procurement operations resulting in a loss of members. However, several of our Top Ten spenders are local authorities with Armagh Council now putting considerable spend through the frameworks. CUBO also seem to be much more pro-active. We will be undertaking a review of the Risk Register as well as looking at Non-Executive Directors length of service.



8. Any Other Business

lan brought up the subject of recruitment and retention as we are often referred to as "Cost Sector Catering" or "Public Sector Catering" and this does not reflect how commercially driven we are be it cafes, street food outlets and Conference and events. Also, we have some competitive pay and rewards packages so the extrinsic motivators are in place but we do not communicate well what we do. TUCO as an organization need to approach UK wide with a video echoing what we do and how professional we are. All our members are currently suffering in the same way with Recruitment and Retention issues and this is a good career and a good sector. He requested that this item be added to the Agenda for the next Board Meeting.

Action: Secretary

We need to bring new talent through into the sector as this is now a threat to the membership.

There was a request for recommendations for Mystery Shopper companies if any member could share this with the region.

Call-off from this Framework Agreement is available for direct award via a ranked supplier process, desktop evaluation or by mini-competitions. The Framework Agreement is formed around a Core product List with fixed pricing and procurement of non-core product items are supported against a discount structure.

Due to known market volatility and to avoid risk premiums being added pricing was only fixed for the first 3 months of the agreement.

The initial request received from Campbells Prime Meat was for an average increase of 17% across 96 line items, both core and non-core. Following further clarification and discussion, the average increase has been reduced 8.5%, across 15 line items.

The overall percentage increase effect on the core product list of each is as follows:

- 2 Aberdeen & Grampians 2.4%
- 3 Perth, Angus, Dundee & Fife 13.5%

Ranking currently remains the same for all lots, with the exception of Lot 4, where Campbell Brothers move to 3rd ranked and George Campbell move to 2nd.

Updated pricing and rankings went live on Monday 19th September 2022 and the Buyers Portal has been updated to reflect this change.

Pricing windows for this agreement will now move to bi-annually, with any agreed price revision applying from 1st August and 1st February each year. Outside of these, all pricing will remain fixed.

JAN1011 AP Cleaning and Janitorial Products

The above Framework Agreement commenced on 2^{nd} August 2022 and will run for two years with the option to be extended for a further 24 months.

It can be accessed by all Scottish universities and colleges as well as APUC Ltd' associate members.

The Framework Agreement is split in to 2 lots and the appointed suppliers are as follows:

Due to the Framework Agreement having only went live on the 2nd August 2022, there has currently been no spend on either lots.

Call-off from this new Framework Agreement is available through direct award via a ranked supplier process, desktop evaluation or by mini-competitions. The Framework Agreement is formed around a Core Product List with fixed pricing and procurement of non-core product items are supported against a discount structure.

The Buyers guide and supporting documentation have all been uploaded to the <u>APUC Buyers Portal</u> and e-catalogues have been developed and are available for e-procurement systems with punchout available for Bunzl Cleaning & Hygiene Supplies Ltd only at present with this functionality being developed with other suppliers.

There was no BT1 Saving recorded against the Framework Agreement on a Versus Previous Price paid analysis, however, it should be noted that the difference in the overall basket of goods between the first ranked supplier of JAN1007 (Bunzl CHS) and the first ranked supplier of JAN1011 (Unico) was 11.5%. Market analysis shows that, since the start of 2022, Janitorial and Cleaning products have risen by approximately 35%.

PROCUREMENT UPDATE

Plastic Packaging Tax

The introduction of the Plastic Packaging Tax which came into force on 1st April 2022 has seen no impact on supply chain pricing as yet, however, we will continue to monitor this.

Supply Chain Impact

APUC and other Purchasing Consortia continue to assess the risk level associated with each Framework and supplier on four consideration points: Labour considerations, Supply Chain considerations, Regulatory considerations, and Commercial considerations. This information is published quarterly through the Market Insight update. If you wish to receive a copy of this please contact <u>Andy Anderson</u>.

We are continuing to work with DEFRA and the Scottish Government to assess when inspections of imported goods to the UK and the likely impacts, but it has been confirmed the UK Government propose to delay the introduction of these until the end of Dec 2023 at the earliest.

The shortages of HGV Drivers and container availability continues to have an impact in the cost of distribution and suppliers views of minimum delivery values and quantities, however, there is no minimum values applied to APUC Frameworks at present.

Ukraine

The ongoing situation in Ukraine continues to have some impact to supply chains and updates are provided I the market insight documents referenced above.

No new tariffs or sanctions have been announced and the recent deal to release grain shipments under safe passage, which began on 1st August, has slightly eased potential pressures on the global market for grain, maize and sunflower oil.

The recent announcement of the UK Government's <u>Energy Bill Relief Scheme</u> is hoped to alleviate some cost pressures in the food industry, but the continuing volatility of energy prices and resultant rise in production and staff costs continue to drive food inflation. Global food prices have risen by over 65% since the start of the covid pandemic and the current rate of inflation is expected to continue in to 2023 at the earliest.

Palm Oil

APUC are continuing to monitor the use of Palm Oil and Responsibly Sourced Palm Oil (RSPO) in its Framework Agreements and the promotion of RSPO certified products and Palm Oil alternatives, where deemed suitable and appropriate, continues. This has been impacted slightly by the reduced availability of Sunflower and Seed oils due to the situation in Ukriane, as mentioned above.

Sustainability and Supply Chain Management

Activities relating to our Responsible Procurement Action plan covering a range of criteria continue, as previously advised. Please see details below for detail of activities and developments:

- Responsible Sourcing and Ethical Trading Applicable criteria are set within the ITT and responses captured and measured prior to appointment and during contractor performance.
- Modern Slavery & Fair Working Practices, including the living wage suppliers approaches and activities in these areas are being monitored and measured as part of the Supply Chain Management Section 1 questionnaire and Supplier and Contract Management process.
- Fair Working Practices, including Living Wage APUC have confirmation of all catering contractor's current stance on their approach to the Living Wage. We continue to track this and suppliers are now asked to confirm their position prior to appointment of a Framework Agreement.
- Modern Slavery Applicable criteria are set within the ITT, where relevant, and responses captured and measured prior to appointment and during contractor performance.
- Carbon Reduction & Climate Change APUC are currently working through the
 Responsible Procurement Action plan to categorise the importance of Climate Change
 Emergency. Delivering both Fruit and Veg and Butcher Meat in departmentalised vans
 (vans have been audited by local council) is available through McLays. Sustainable route
 planning is also being encouraged throughout all fresh food tenders, alongside
 consolidation and aggregation of deliveries to Institutions in neighbouring areas.
- CEPWG PIACC APUC are currently working on a Primary Impact Area for Climate Change document concerning food. This document is available for the sector to view and will be updated as and when required. If there are any examples or case studies you would like to be included as part of this document, please contact Andy Anderson.
- APUC have also been working on the FNT2030 plan for catering. For more information on this, or to receive a copy, please contact <u>Andy Anderson</u>.
- The ability to use contractors as distributors under catering Framework Agreements not only enables smaller and local producers to enter the supply chain but reduces the number of deliveries and associated carbon footprint.
- Call-off methods all catering framework agreements now have the option of Desktop Award built in as a call-off method. For assistance in using this alternative call-off method, please contact Andy Anderson.
- Other Waste and Pollution reduction A reminder that Institutions can purchase 'wonky' fruit and vegetables under CAT1061-AP. Not only does this action reduce food waste but

can also contribute to potential budget savings. APUC are currently working to encourage this to more suppliers throughout the geographical lots. Suppliers can also offer 'Soup' Veg - (vegetables that are not aesthetically pleasing or don't have a long shelf life) to Institutions who may be interested.

SCM Responsible Procurement Supply Chain Evaluation Tool

APUC's SCM Responsible Supply Chain programme is the process through which we engage with appointed contractors to assess their approach to delivering a transparent, environmentally positive, ethical and socially responsible supply chain.

All suppliers have been requested to complete Section 1, now incorporated in to our SCM Supply Chain Management tool.

EcoVadis

APUC work with EcoVadis, an independent sustainability ratings agency, to assess our supply chain and the sustainability of key suppliers for the sector is continuing. We now have nearly 130 suppliers who have undertaken assessment and a further phase of suppliers have been identified and invited to participate in an analysis of their organisation and supply chain.

Single Use Plastic

Scottish Government's <u>regulations</u> on the restrictions of single-use plastics came in to force in June 2022. For further information on items affected, please see <u>here.</u>

APUC Ltd continue to push suppliers to reduce single use plastic from their supply chain as a matter of course, through using items such as compostable or re-usable packaging and pallets, some suppliers (Total Produce) on CAT1061 AP Fresh Fruit and Vegetables agreement have removed single use plastic from their supply chain within 18 months. Contractors who were successful on the Fresh Fish and Seafood tender can also provide re-usable or cardboard crates. Suppliers on the Butcher Meat agreement are also working to create an alternative plastic packaging system that can be used for products which require to be vacuum packed. This product is currently in the testing phase and, if successful, should be implemented towards the end of 2022.

Graham's the Dairy have also provided information on all their packaging and have confirmed that, for the core product list, all packaging is from 100% recycled content and can be recycled once used. Graham's have also invested in milk cartons and these are now going through test phases with some supermarkets and clients, with a view that they will become a core item in the coming weeks.

Targets and actions have been set and agreed with key suppliers and performance on these and other strategic objectives are being monitored and measured as part of our Supplier and Contract Management programme. We remain keen to hear from members what their key points of consideration and requirements are so these can be included and discussed with the relevant supply chain.

As previously advised, the Procurement Reform Act (Scotland) 2014 (PRA) requires every public sector contracting authority to consider how procurement can improve local social, economic and environmental wellbeing; facilitate involvement of SMEs; and promote innovation (where factors are relevant to what is being procured and it is proportionate to take account of them). APUC Ltd include all of these in their catering related Framework Agreements and the potential sustainable benefits are listed in the Buyers Guide. This includes the added value services and Community

Benefits available and the delivery of these are also being tracked as part of our Contract and Supplier Management process.

As previously advised, examples from recently awarded Framework Agreements include:

- Products Sourced: Ethically & sustainably sourced / eco-friendly product alternatives available within the Core List
- Support towards external accreditation schemes including Food for Life
- Work placements and modern apprenticeships schemes, Community support programmes, promote healthy eating through sponsoring events
- availability of organic, Fairtrade or 'wonky' Fruit and Vegetables (see above), advice on seasonal produce and assistance with Menu planning
- Waste collection service Access to Closed Loop Recycling scheme on request
 - Ability to introduce local producers into the supply chain, using the appointed contractor as a distributor.

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About TUCO's framework agreements

We currently use 3 types of procedure under Public Contracts Regulations 2015

Restricted

The 2 stage, restricted procedure permits TUCO to "pre-qualify" suppliers based on their financial standing and technical or professional capability so as to narrow the number permitted to submit bids at the ITT stage (i.e. stage 2).

Open In an open procedure, anyone may submit a full tender as there is no "pre-qualification" of bidders.

DPS

There are two stages to this procedure; similar to the more commonly used restricted procedure, stage one is the pre-qualification stage and stage two is the award stage. TUCO have already carried out stage one in order to create a pre-qualified list of suppliers however approved users (i.e. Buyers / TUCO Members) MUST complete Stage 2. Approved users (buyers, TUCO members) award individual local contracts through the DPS. The buyer (TUCO member) invites all potential suppliers on the DPS (authorised supplier list) or within a particular lot to participate in a further competition bid for a specific contract. Suppliers must have a minimum of 10 days to submit their tender. Suppliers are not obliged to bid. All stage 2 document templates have already been created and are available for members to download and tailor to their individual requirements before issuing to the DPS suppliers. A contract award notice must be placed within 30 days of award by the TUCO member.

FCS
