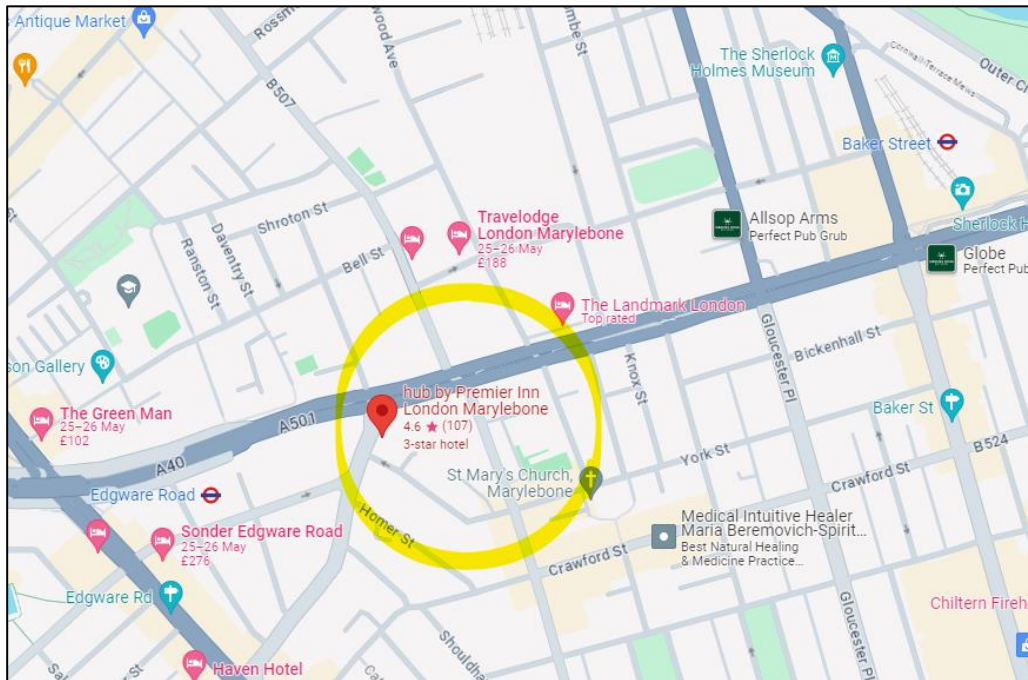


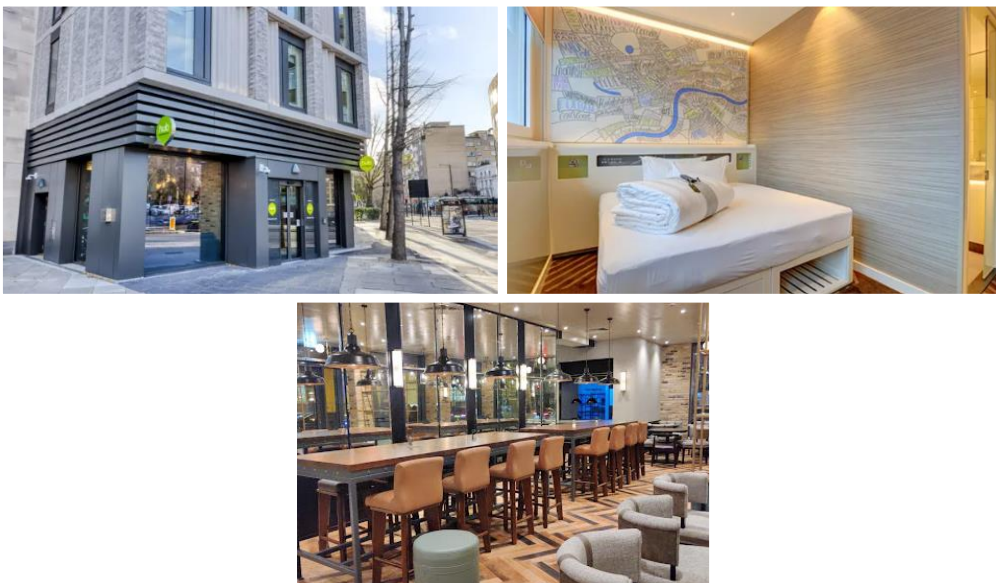
Day 1: Thursday 13th June

11:00 - 11:30: Please make your own way to London and meet the other members of the tour in the lobby of the [Hub by Premier Inn Hotel, Marylebone](#).

- Board: single occupancy, room only – amenities include free WiFi, hairdryer and underbed storage (the rooms are compact!)

The hotel is located 15 minutes' walk from Paddington rail station, and 5 minutes' walk from both Edgware Road and Marylebone underground stations. If rooms are ready the group can check in, luggage can be left in a secure area of the hotel if not.

11:30 – 12:00: Group to make their way towards Regent’s Park, the venue for the TASTE Festival. (15 minute walk).



12:00 – 16:00: The group will attend the afternoon session of the TASTE festival. For those who would like a more hands on experience, head immediately to the registration area to get the best chance to sign up to the ‘Cook Schools’. From this point the group can soak up the atmosphere and enjoy some of the delicious foods, drinks and entertainment on offer.

16:00 – 17:30: In between sessions at TASTE, the group can enjoy a drink together in a reserved space at the nearby [Thirsty Scholar pub](#), 1 Park Cres, London W1B 1SH. (10-15 minute walk). This time will also be used to return to the hotel and check in if rooms were not available in the morning.



17:30 – 21:30: Return to Regent’s Park to enjoy TASTE’s evening session.

21:30: Return to the hotel. (15-20 minute walk).

Day 2: Friday 14th June

08:30: Please meet the rest of the group in the hotel lobby and check out. Once again, luggage may be left within a secure area of the hotel.

08:30 - 09:00: Travel to the breakfast venue via public transport.

09:00 - 10:30: With Taste Festival featuring some of London's best restaurants, why not try one of London's best breakfast venues? [The Wolseley](#) is a mainstay of the London breakfast scene, and often features amongst lists of the city's best breakfast spots, such as those compiled by Time Out and Secret London. 10:30 - 11:00: Group to make their way towards Fitzrovia to enjoy a coffee at one of the capitals more unusual venues; a former Victorian toilet that has been lovingly transformed into one of London's top speciality coffee & brunch cafes.

11:00 – 11:30: Built around 1890 and mothballed in the 1960s, [Attendant Coffee Roasters](#) Fitzrovia premises was dormant for more than fifty years. After two-years' of planning and restoration, the original Doulton & Co porcelain urinals have become an inspired line with green seating to match the original Victorian floor tiles. 11:30 - 12:00: Energised by a healthy dose of caffeine, the group will make their way towards Regent's Park for the Friday afternoon session of the TASTE festival.



12:00 - 16:00: A final chance to try that dish that you've had your eye on, attend that taste session, or swap details with that supplier. By the end of Friday's session hopefully you will have identified some trends to try within your institution, had some ideas about how to market your products, and extended your peer network within the industry.

16:00: This is the end of the study tour. Return to the hotel to collect luggage and make onward journeys.

What's included?
